Registrations: All clubs are required to enter their teams online using the SEMS by 9 AM on Thursday 31st January 2019. **No Late entries will be accepted for these events.** Please note, Clubs when doing Carnival entries, will be required to enter teams in individual events. If you have any questions regarding this, please direct them to Toby Whitton (SLST Volunteer Support Officer) or ask Liz Eustace (Carnival Recorder) to talk you through how to do this before the event. Also, please ensure that all awards paperwork for new award holders has been submitted before trying to enter your members, as SEMS System will not allow members to enter who are still showing on SurfGuard as not proficient or currently holding the award.

Assessors: To ensure that sufficient personnel are available to efficiently conduct these championships, a system will be implemented whereby clubs must provide a minimum of:

a) **1 Assessor or Official per team entered**

b) **1 Patient** per club for the entire event

High Visibility Vests: All competitors **MUST** wear high visibility vests when competing. Please refer to the Page 18 of the [SLSA Personal Protective Equipment \(PPE\) Project Final Report – Surf Sports](#) for further information.

Rules for a race: To conduct a championship event a minimum of 2 competitors or teams are required to be entered.
Equipment: Please read below for event equipment requirements. All equipment must be as per SLSA standards.

Open, U/17 & U/15 Patrol Competition

The aim is to conduct a Patrol Championship to find the best Club Patrol Team in Tasmania. The Open Patrol Competition is a Tasmanian Championship event and is awarded points towards the Premier Club of Tasmania.

Nominations: The competition will be classed as a final with entries restricted to one team (of 4 for U15 and U/17 and 6 for Open) per club unless there are less than ten teams. Clubs may indicate that they would like to enter two teams, and if all ten places are not filled, the second team from clubs (decided by ballot) will be notified that their entry has been accepted.

Note: To be eligible to compete, all members must be a registered member of SLSA, have passed a SLSA Proficiency/Skills maintenance Test within the current season and completed the required patrol hours for his or her membership category. Eligibility is otherwise as defined in Section 2, Competition Eligibility, of the Surf Sports Manual 35th Edition.

NB – ALL Open team members (all 6) must be current Advanced Resuscitation certificate holders and that you also require one SMIRB driver and one IRB crewperson. Also please note that the resuscitation includes use of the AED. 1 member minimum (of the 4 person) U17 Patrol team must be a current Advanced Resuscitation certificate holder.

The Competition:

(a) Points shall be allotted for the following:

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| Theory Paper | 20 points |
| Resuscitation | 20 points |
| Lifesaving Task | 40 points |
| Physical Skills – Surf Teams | 10 points |
| Physical Skills – Board/Tube Rescue Relay Race | 10 points |
| TOTAL | 100 POINTS |

Each section will be conducted in accordance with:

- The SLSA Surf Sports Manual, 35th Edition
- The SLSA Public Safety and Aquatic Rescue Manual, 35th Edition

Equipment:

Each team shall provide as a minimum the following equipment:

- One Rescue Board Note: For this event, a racing board may be used instead of a rescue board in all races but a rescue board must still be used in the Patrol Competition scenario
- One Rescue Tube
- A First Aid Kit (Refer Surf Sports Manual)
- One pair of Swim fins (optional)

Open, U/17 & U15 First Aid Competition

The aim is to conduct a First Aid Championship to find the best First Aid team in Tasmania. The First Aid Competition is a Tasmanian Championship event and points are awarded towards the Premier Club of SLS Tasmania.

Nominations: The competition will be classed as a final with entries restricted to one team (of 2 competitors) per club unless there are less than ten teams. Clubs may indicate that they would like to enter two teams, and if all ten places are not filled, the second team from clubs (decided by ballot) will be notified that their entry has been accepted.

Note: To be eligible to compete, all members must be a financial, registered, proficient member of SLST and have fulfilled patrol hour requirements. Eligibility is otherwise as defined in Section 2, Competition Eligibility, of the Surf Sports Manual 35th Edition and subsequent bulletins.

The Competition:

Will run as per the details as set down in the Surf Sports Manual 35th Revised Edition and subsequent bulletins.

Open and U17 Teams are to consist of two (2) proficient Surf Life Saving Bronze Medallion/Cert II holders and/or current SLSA Provide First Aid Certificate (or equivalent).

U15 Teams are to consist of two (2) proficient Surf Life Saving Surf Rescue Certificate or Surf Life Saving Bronze Medallion/Cert II holders.

Dress: The competitors of each Team shall be uniformly dressed as follows:

- Club Competition cap
- Club bathers
- White shorts and shirt, or Club coloured shorts and shirts or Patrol Uniform
- Footwear can be worn

NB: No item worn by a competitor is permitted to be used to treat a casualty.

Equipment:

Club teams are required to supply their own First Aid Kit as per the 35th Revised Edition of the SLSA Surf Sports Manual and subsequent bulletins. This kit will be inspected as per the list from pages 3-82. Contents of this kit may be used to make up a bum bag prior to the scenario.
