## Call for Expressions of Interest for Volunteers for surf lifesaving training and event safety program in Fiji

| <b>Summary</b>         | <p>SLST seeks a number of volunteers to assist with supporting water safety for the production of a TV show being filmed in Fiji and delivering community surf lifesaving training programs. The production company is working with SLST to provide a professional development opportunity for up to 10 volunteer members (who meet the eligibility criteria).</p> <p>The intention is that each volunteer will be available for 2-3 week rotations from late August to the middle of October 2019. The first volunteer is required to begin around the 21st August 2019. The last rotation of volunteers will return on or around 15th October 2019. A pre-departure induction will be provided as well as support throughout the program. Flights, accommodation and meals will be covered.</p> |

### Background

Surf Life Saving Tasmania (SLST) conducted some initial development programs in Fiji in the early 2000s. SLST progressed this work with Fiji Surfing for surf lifesaving programs in the country to provide water safety and rescue skills to reduce lives lost in the water

The aim of the upcoming program and ongoing relationship is to progress and support Surf Life Saving Fiji, which is delivered in partnership with Fiji Surfing. SLST is providing this opportunity to members who show commitment to ongoing professional development. This further supports SLST's commitment to reduce drowning incidents worldwide as an ILSF (International Life Saving Federation) member.

In recent years, SLST volunteers visited Samoa on 2-weekly rotations to further develop a community resilience program that will build capacity and awareness in the water for those who live in and visit Samoa. This led to SLST supporting a larger surf lifesaving training program and providing water safety for the production of a TV show being filmed in Samoa and last year in Fiji. The upcoming program in Fiji will follow a similar format. SLST has secured support for 2 volunteers to be assigned at once, instead of the previous agreement of 1 at a time. This enables volunteers at different stage of their development pathway and ages to support each other and to apply to be considered.

### **Volunteer Selection Requirements**

The successful volunteers will assist with training and water safety. We ask that the successful candidates address the following criteria;

#### **Essential**

1. Aged 18 years and older
2. Hold a current Bronze Medallion/ Certificate II in Public Safety (Aquatic Rescue)
3. Hold a Silver Medallion Beach Management award (Patrol Captain)
4. Be actively volunteering in member training and development program roles (e.g. Lifesaving Development Camp, training and assessment at your club)
5. Be flexible and adaptable in training and water safety techniques
6. Can deliver training and communicate to culturally and linguistically diverse individuals
7. Able and confident in delivering efficient handover of work packages, e.g. handing over to the next volunteer with zero to minimal disruption to service
8. Experience coordinating water safety for water events and communicating to event management
9. Have a current passport (valid for at least 6 months)
10. Have a manual Driver's License
11. Can depart for Fiji between end of August (exact date – TBC) through to 15<sup>th</sup> October 2019

#### **Desirable**

1. Hold a Silver Medallion Beach Aquatic Rescue award
2. Hold a Silver Medallion IRB Driver
3. Advanced Scuba Diver (or higher)

The successful volunteers will be selected based on the response to selection and a telephone interview to be conducted late July/early August 2019.

### **Subsidy**

All flight costs, transport, accommodation, laundry, phone and meals will be covered for the successful volunteers.
