Title: Australian Surf Life Saving Championships 2021 Final Carnival Circular
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Department: Sport
Audience: State/Territory Surf Sport Managers, Directors, Club Secretaries and Team Managers, Branches, State/Territory CEO's Sport Standing Committee
Summary: This document contains important information about the 2021 Australian Youth, Masters & Opens Surf Life Saving Championships to be held on the Sunshine Coast from Friday 16 April to Saturday 24 April 2021.

COVID-19 UNPREDICABILITY

This document has been prepared with the best intentions based on current State Health Authority information regarding COVID-19 restrictions and related border movements. However, as has been noted over many months this information is constantly changing and as such all officials, athletes, coaches and supporters should be prepared to allow for some flexibility in their planning. SLSA will do their best to provide advance notice on the listed options and possible further amendments however, again, as has been witnessed over many months COVID-19 restrictions can be amended with little to no notice by the various State Health Authorities.

SLSA is actively working with QLD Health and the Sunshine Coast City Council to finalise the COVID Safe Plan for the Championships. Due to the dynamic nature of the COVID-19 pandemic, and related restrictions, SLSA cannot guarantee there will be no amendments to the event and/or the timetable of races leading into and during the Championships. All endeavours are being examined and discussed to keep the event as normal as possible however SLSA acknowledges that due to the COVID-19 pandemic there are likely to be restrictions in some form placed on the Championships.

DISTRIBUTION OF THIS CIRCULAR

It is most important that the information in this Circular be brought to the attention of carnival officials, team managers, coaches and competitors. Non-receipt of this circular will not be taken as an excuse if a club, team or individual does not comply with the requirements outlined in this and other circulars which refer to the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships 2021.

NEW FOR 2021 – ACCREDITATION & LYCRA COLLECTION

Please pay special attention to the section in this circular around accreditation and lycra collection. Due to COVID-19 restrictions and guidelines, each participant at Aussies 2021 (competitor, official, club support, spectator) will need to visit the accreditation and lycra Centre to pick up their own accreditation and lycra. SAFETY & EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

SAFETY

All Competitors and Officials are referred to the Introduction on page (i) of the current edition of the SLSA Surf Sports Manual and in particular but not only paragraphs (d), (e) and (f). Paragraph (d) states:

"Surf lifesaving can be inherently dangerous. Serious accidents can and often do happen which may result in property damage, physical injury and even death. All members are assumed to have voluntarily read and understood this warning and accept and assume the inherent risks in surf lifesaving."

A Safety Operations Manual has been developed for use by the Safety & Emergency Committee (SEC), the Competition Committee (ACCC), officials and relevant personnel. These guides have been refined for use for the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships 2021.

Water safety as part of the competition, is ultimately the responsibility of the SEC & ACCC, based on the advice of the Safety and Emergency Management Coordinator, the Championship Referee and Officials in determining postponement or cancellation of any or all events, or relocation to an alternate venue in accordance with Section 1 - Competition Safety, of the current edition of the SLSA Surf Sports Manual, any subsequent amending bulletins, and this Circular.

The Championship Referee and Safety and Emergency Management Coordinator will conduct safety briefings to Officials and Team Managers before commencement of competition and during the event as required.

Risk assessors have been appointed to assist the Safety and Emergency Management Coordinator to provide ongoing assessment of conditions and safety across the carnival area. They will create an effective communications channel to the Safety and Emergency Management Coordinator and Competition Committee. Those Officials may seek advice from competitors and team representatives to ensure an informed opinion is provided and can be acted upon where appropriate.

Competitor/Team Manager Briefings will be conducted 30 minutes prior to the start of competition each day. These briefings will be conducted in each area by the Area Referee and/or the Sectional Referee.

At the conclusion of each race, each competitor may be issued with a decal, regardless of their placing, including those that have completed the race outside qualifying competitors, disqualified competitors and those that did not finish. Competitors that do not start the race will also be recorded. Each competitor must present the decal in person to the Area Recorder.

PLEASE NOTE:

- All competitors participating in The Aussies 2021, **must** wear a **yellow** Lycra vest. Failure to comply with this safety measure may result in disciplinary action against the individual and club.
- For warm up and training competitors may wear pink lycras. In all competition **YELLOW LYCRAS** must be worn.
- For the duration of the Championships, Surf Life Saving will provide water safety from 7.00am to 8.00am for the purpose of water safety during warm-ups.
- Powercraft & water safety requirements are set in place for the duration of the Championships, inclusive of Youth, Masters & Opens Championships.

INCIDENT PROCEDURES

Surf Life Saving Australia has a range of incident protocols in place for Aussies 2021 including designated search and response teams. In the event of a shallow water search, event organisers may seek further assistance from some competitors who hold a Bronze Medallion.

DRONES ON SITE

Please ensure that all competitors and travelling family members are aware that no unauthorised drones are permitted at the 2021 Championships, including all respective arenas and surrounding locations.



CONTINGENCY PLANNING

A contingency plan has been developed as part of SLSA risk management planning and its duty under the Work Health and Safety Act and regulations to ensure health and safety risks are eliminated so far as reasonably practicable.

In the presence of natural or man-made hazards, particularly unfavourable weather and / or surf conditions preventing the conduct of part, or the whole of the competition events, it is essential that a clear and simple Contingency Plan be established to relocate events to alternate locations.

The decision to enact this Contingency Plan is the responsibility of the ACCC. The Championship Referee and the Safety and Emergency Management Coordinator are responsible to the ACCC for recommendations concerning competition safety. The Safety Operations Manual developed for this event is to be applied when considering and making recommendations, in consultation with relevant emergency services and lifesaving authorities (i.e. Sunshine Coast Council and SLSQ).

A review of the following will be conducted at each ACCC meeting:

- a) Risk Assessment of the current conditions of the beach
- b) Injury management statistics
- c) Current weather predictions
- d) Competition Statistics

CONTINGENCY OPTIONS

The ACCC have a number of contingency options available to consider, these are:

Option 1 – Reschedule Program

This option allows the ACCC to change the program to suit the prevailing conditions that may be experienced during competition. This may require rescheduling of one or all of the competition arenas, including changes to courses, starts and finishes.

Youth Championship Events

Given the limited time frame for the conduct of the Youth Championships once underway priority will be given to concluding any events that have commenced and then to the conduct of events that can be completed in the allotted time. The carnival committee will however have total discretion in what events are conducted.

Masters Championship Events

The carnival committee will have total discretion in what events are conducted should there be a need to rationalise the events conducted. The age and number of competitors in each event will be a consideration in the priority given to which events may or may not be included in a reduced program for the Masters' Championships although once underway priority will be given to concluding any events that have commenced and then to the conduct of events that can be completed in the allotted time.

Open Championship Events

Open events will be given priority over age events then decreasing in age.

Where events are relocated to alternative sites then the program must be amended to ensure the safe completion of the competition.

The Championship Referee has autonomy to make minor changes to the program but must advise the Chairman of the ACCC at the earliest opportunity.

Option 2 – Use of an Alternative Competition Arena at Event Beach

The ACCC may see fit to change the competition arenas allocated to the various Age Groups or Events. The ACCC may consider these options due to hazardous conditions requiring a safer location for less experienced competitors.

Option 3 – Move to Carnival Arenas North or South along the beach

This option is for the movement of the competition arenas north or south along the current beach. This option may be considered due to environmental issues being identified, e.g. lack of beach. This option may require the movement of one arena or all of the arenas.

Option 4 – Partial Relocation away from Event Beach

This option allows the majority of the Championships support infrastructure, TV, sponsors' signage and other Championships infrastructure to remain at the Championships Beach. Such items are not considered essential to the conduct of the competition. Following a risk assessment, if conditions are deemed unsafe for particular events, those events will then be relocated to an alternative venue where conditions are more suitable.

Primary and secondary alternative locations may be considered for this option where appropriate.

Option 5 – Complete Relocation of Championships

Complete relocation of the Championships including sponsors' signage and TV, etc. The entire carnival infrastructure will be duplicated, where practical, at the alternate site except for the TV commentary stand.

This option is planned to occur only at the primary alternative surf location.

ALTERNATIVE LOCATIONS – CONTINGENCIES

These locations have been identified as suitable for relocation of all or a large component of the Championships. This does not preclude individual events being relocated to these sites if appropriate. Infrastructure will be installed at these sites prior to the commencement of the Championships and comprehensive plans developed to facilitate any move.

Surf Location

- Mooloolaba - All events can be conducted at this venue
- Kings Beach

Protected Water Location



- Kawana Lakes

A final decision regarding the use of any contingency site will be dictated by a risk assessment at that site.

SLSA have also investigated other beaches along the QLD coastline as potential contingency venues and have ruled them out due to unavailability, not suitable for Aussies, unable to gain permission from local authorities to hold our event, distance, etc.

COVID -19 RESPONSE

In an effort to make the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships (The Aussies) as safe and risk free as possible, whilst still delivering an exceptional championship experience, Surf Life Saving Australia has made some changes to our event day operations as per our COVID Safe Event Plan.

Our COVID Safe Plan for the Aussies has been constructed in full consultation with QLD Health.

While we hope to make The Aussies 'on beach' experience as close as possible to normal you will notice some changes leading into the event, and during the Championships. These changes will broadly affect all athletes, officials, coaches, team management, spectators, club members, event personnel, contractors and workforce.

HEALTH SCREENING

If any registered athlete, team manager, official, club member, event personnel, contractor and workforce member or close contact have COVID-19 symptoms (click here for list of symptoms) from 1 April up to and including the start of the Aussies 16 April, we ask that you please do not attend the event. Contact us at events@slsa.asn.au or 02 9215 8000 by 3:00pm Thursday 15 April to discuss your event entry options. Requests received after this time will not be considered.

Maintain good hygiene practices at all times, including: regular hand washing and sanitisation when entering venues, after using the bathroom and before and after handling food; and covering your mouth and nose if you need to cough or sneeze. Hand wash facilities are available through the event site. Additionally, hand sanitiser will be available at all venues and aid stations.

Download the Australian Government COVID Safe App onto your mobile phone and ensure the app is turned on. Visit the Apple App Store or Google Play to download.

Comply with any QLD Health direction and respect event staff, security or emergency services staff.

MASKS

Wearing masks can help reduce the spread of COVID-19. As per the current QLD Health advice, in all areas of Queensland you must carry a face mask with you at all times when you leave home/accommodation, unless you have a lawful reason not to. You must wear a mask in indoor spaces and it is strongly recommended you wear a mask when outdoors if you are unable to stay more than 1.5m distance from other people, such as busy walkways and thoroughfares. <https://www.qld.gov.au/health/conditions/health-alerts/coronavirus-covid-19/protect-yourself-others/face-masks>

SLSA strongly recommends that everyone who is attending the Aussies brings their own personnel mask so they can comply with QLD Health advice. SLSA will have a limited number of Face masks on site for anyone who requires one. When visiting the admin centre and Accreditation & Lycra collection, please wear a mask.

ACCREDITATION

At Aussies 2021 all athletes, officials and club members will be given an accreditation lanyard containing an RFID chip which will be automatically scanned at all designated beach entry and exit points in addition to back of beach areas.



Accreditation lanyards must be worn to gain access to any competition areas or back of beach areas.

Accreditation lanyards must be worn around the neck on the outside of all clothing, clearly visible to COVID marshals or security who will be present at all entry and exit points.

SLSA will be operating an accreditation and check in process at the Aussies in 2021. Your Accreditation Lanyard will allow you access to the event without the need to scan the QR code on your smart phone each time you enter an area.

Every person other than officials (officials accreditation will be issued in the Officials area Alexandra Headland Park, Aerodrome Rd Maroochydore) who attends Aussies that pre-registers will have their Aussies accreditation available to collect from the Accreditation and Lycra collection marquee (Pierce Park, next to the Admin Centre Maroochydore) from Wednesday 14 April till Tuesday 20 April 2021. Any collection after these dates can be done from the Admin Centre. The Accreditation and Lycra Collection marquee will operate during the following times:

DAILY CHECK-IN AND CONTACT TRACING

All areas of the Aussies will have designated SIGN POSTED entry and exit points. For the duration of the Championships everyone will be required to enter and exit an area via the designated points.

Entry and exit to each area will be electronically recorded via two methods:

Accreditation Lanyard – if you have registered for the event and received a lanyard you will be required to wear the lanyard on the outside of your clothing at all times. The lanyard contains an RFID chip that will be automatically scanned as you walk into and out of an area. You do not need to do anything further.

QR Code – **if you are not registered for the event or you have forgotten your lanyard** you will be required to scan the QR code at each entry point with your smart phone and fill in the appropriate details each time you enter an area. SLSA will be utilising the QLD Government QR code system. Signs will be appropriately displayed at each entry point.

Parts of the event site will be ‘restricted access areas’, including Officials HUB, VIP Areas, Competition Areas and the various event compounds. Where only those with the correct accreditation will be allowed access, so please keep an eye out for signage around the venue that explains this.

SPECTATORS

Spectators are encouraged to attend this year’s Aussies and apply to all COVID rules and regulations, such as maintaining a physical distancing requirements of 1.5m. If you do come to the event, please ensure you “check in” to the event. This can be done in two ways;

Go to the Accreditation Marquee located in Pierce Park Maroochydore, register your details and for the price of a coffee (\$5) receive an Accreditation Lanyard that will allow you to enter the Aussies on any day and ensure we can successfully contact trace your movements in and out of the venue. For younger attendees i.e. under 12, they will be required to either check in with parents going to particular zones or register for their own contact tracing lanyard.

For any single day visitors/spectators or a few hour visitors/spectators we will have in place QR codes at every entry and exit point to the venue. It is a requirement that you contact trace and scan the QR code when you



enter each and every area. To ensure a COVID Safe Event and to ensure we have successfully contact traced everyone who attends the Aussies it is essential that all visitors and spectators who don't have an accreditation lanyard take the time to scan the QR code and check in. Anyone who fails to check in via the QR code or doesn't have an accreditation lanyard will be asked to leave the venue.

COMPETITION INFORMATION

CHAMPIONSHIP COMMITTEES

The Australian Surf Life Saving Championships 2021 are managed by four committees.

The committees include:

- Australian Event Organising Committee (AEOC)
- Australian Championships Competition Committee (ACCC)
- Safety & Emergency Committee (SEC)
- Event Operations Committee (EOC)

CHANGES TO EXISTING ENTRIES

Changes to already existing entries can occur up until Normal Entries close at 5pm (AEDT), 29 March 2021 via SEMS. After this date, an admin fee of \$10 per change to an already existing competitor can occur up until 4:00pm (AEST) the day before the race, through visiting the Administration Centre only. This is for individual entries. Changes to the composition of teams can occur until marshalling commences. There is no charge for a team change if the competitor is already entered in the carnival. If the competitor has not previously entered into this carnival a late entry fee of \$200 shall be charged.

[Note 1: Changes will not be permitted for Surf Board riding events after the close of entries date.](#)

ENTRY AFTER ONLINE ENTRIES CLOSE

Entire Club Late Entries – If an entire club does not submit entries before the normal entry closing date (5pm, Monday 29 March 2021, AEDT), the club needs to request permission to enter by directing a letter to the Competition Committee via events@slsa.asn.au explaining the exceptional circumstances for late entry.

SUBSTITUTIONS

Any substitutions will only be accepted as listed in the General Competitive Conditions – Substitution of Competitors in the current edition of the SLSA Surf Sports Manual (and any amending Bulletins). Clubs and/or State Centres may be permitted to make substitutions at no charge as long as the competitor is already entered into the Championships. If a substitution occurs with a new competitor who is not already entered into the Championships, the relevant entry fee will be charged.

ADMINISTRATION CENTRE

The main Championships Administration Centre will be located in the Festival Zone at Pierce Park, Alexandra Parade, Maroochydore. There will be a noticeboard at the administration center with general information, event draws, maps, timetables, shuttle services etc.

The administration center will be open from 7:00am – 5:00pm, Wednesday 14th April – Saturday 24th April.

This year each individual athlete is responsible for the collection of their own competition lycra. Lycras will be provided to each athlete when they collect their Accreditation Pass. Please come prepared knowing what size lycra you require, sizes are available from XS to 4XL. Unfortunately, due to COVID-19 restrictions you cannot change or swap your lycra.

MANDATORY TEAM MANAGERS BRIEFING

The Championship Referees have requested that Team Managers' briefings for Youth, Masters and Opens Championships be held for general instruction on requirements and conditions for the conduct of these championships online.

Login details for these online briefings will be sent out closer to the date of the briefing and will also be posted on Team App.

Team Managers managing club members in the Youth Aussies are required to attend the Youth Aussies briefing and managers of teams in the Masters and Opens Championships are required to attend the Masters & Opens briefings.

As part of the Australian Championships safety procedures, the safety, COVID-19 and contingency plans will be communicated in detail at this briefing. Failure to attend the relevant briefing/s may result in the Club's entries being refused and/or the Club referred to the Australian Championships Competition Committee for further action. As part of SLSA's administration processes, the briefings will be recorded.

YOUTH CHAMPIONSHIPS

All Youth Team Events will be run over the Under 15 Course for respective events. All Youth Events will be run under the 'no break' rule **RANDOM DRAWS**

For all 3 Championships (Youth, Masters and Open) Competitors will be issued with a random draw number for all heats for both individual and team events. The random draw numbers will published via Team App prior to the commencement of each Championship.

All athletes must be aware of their random draw heat number when being marshalled for each event.



WARM UP/TRAINING – WATER SAFETY

To continue safety improvements in 2021, separate swim/craft warm up areas before competition commences each day will continue to apply. The following competition areas can be used specifically for either swim warm-ups or craft warm-ups:

Swim – Solid color areas i.e Pink

Craft – Split color areas i.e. Black & White

Lycras may be worn by anyone swimming before or after competition. High-Vis lycras must be worn for training and warm up and by all participants (e.g.: competitors, Team Managers, coaches, officials, etc.) wanting to enter the water during competition hours. It is therefore recommended to bring old lycras from previous competitions for this purpose as additional lycras will not be distributed.

Competitors are asked to work with referees and officials if they wish to warm up/down between events and cannot get specified areas.

We ask that Team Managers and clubs communicate this information to members in the lead up to the championships so that we continue to improve the overall operation of the championships.

We also ask that you work with Area and Sectional referees to clarify any issues and/or be updated on any changes once the championships have commenced.

VIDEO EQUIPMENT & PLAY BACK FACILITIES

Where available throughout The Aussies 2021, video equipment and play back facilities will continue to be used at some finish lines and judging areas for the boat, swim, craft and beach competition areas.

PROTEST/APPEALS

All protests shall be lodged with the appropriate carnival official in accordance with the procedures outlined in the current edition of the SLSA Surf Sports Manual and shall identify the specific sections/clauses in the Surf Sports Manual upon which the protest is based.

Protest/Appeal Forms will be readily available from the Competitor Liaison Officers located in the various competition areas. A fee of \$150.00 AUD per appeal (incl. GST), must be paid to lodge an appeal with the Appeals Committee. Should the appeal be successful, the fee will be refunded.

SCRUTINEERING

Team Managers and competitors are strongly advised to ensure that their skis and boards, reels and surf belts, surf lines, swim fins, rescue tubes and surf boats, etc. strictly comply with the SLSA Policy Statements as applicable, before departure for these Championships.

Team Managers must read and understand the instructions in the Scrutineering Circular 31/20-21 and ensure that their competitors do likewise. Having no knowledge of the procedures and requirements of Scrutineering Circular 31/20-21 will not be an excuse if the directions contained therein are not followed.

POWERCRAFT

Please ensure that your club is up-to-date with the powercraft requirements for 2021. This includes powercraft shifts and provision of craft. As per the Powercraft Circular 29/20-21 any IRB personnel (driver or crew) not considered to be at a competent level for water safety purposes, the club will be responsible to find replacement personnel. The relevant club may be referred to the ACCC for further action. Insurance coverage is provided for IRB equipment supplied by clubs while in use for the duration of the Championships.

Please ensure all clubs have looked at the Powercraft Roster and are aware of their requirements.



DRESS OF COMPETITORS/OFFICIALS

In all events, competitors must wear approved competition dress as detailed in the 36th edition of the Surf Sports Manual and any subsequent Bulletins or Circulars.

Approval may be granted by the Championship Referee for a club or competitor to wear a singlet or vest different to the supplied singlet provided it complies with the SLSA Sponsorship Policy 6.28 (available via the SLSA Member's Area). This approval is subject to colour and visibility of the club/competitor singlets being fluoro yellow **ONLY**. This must be presented for approval at the Team Managers' Briefings. The approved lycra singlets may **ONLY** then be worn during the heats. For the Quarter Finals, Semi Finals and Finals the SLSA branded event lycra singlets must be worn; **NO EXCEPTIONS**. Competitors will be checked at the start line and no competitor will be allowed to compete unless they comply.

SLSA Staff, Championship Referee, Area Referee and/or Sectional Referee reserve the right to order the removal or covering of signage, ID or logos in conflict with the Championships sponsor and/or the SLSA Sponsorship Policy 6.28.

SPONSORED EVENTS/COMMERCIAL IDENTIFICATION

It is a condition of entry to the 2021 Australian Surf Life Saving Championships that competitors may be required to carry sponsor logos/identification on craft, boats, and equipment. However, if this occurs every effort will be made not to cover other signage, provided it does not conflict with sponsors of the Championships. For further details regarding sponsorship, refer to Policy 6.28 – Sponsorship available online in the Members Area.

The Championships have major partner and event partner sponsors that contribute and support the running of the championships. The following details clarify the requirements of all sponsored competitors/clubs participating in the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships 2021.

- Finalists in the sponsored events may be required to carry event sponsor signage affixed on craft or equipment.
- Finalists in the U19 Male & Female IronMan & IronWomen Finals and Open Male & Female IronMan & IronWoman finals will be required to wear specific lycras to be given to competitors when marshalling for these events.
- Finalists in all ski craft events will be required to wear a specific lycra to be given to competitors when marshalling for these events.
- Finalists in all ski craft events will be required to affix Sea-Doo sponsor sticker on the front of the craft, as outlined in figure A. This sticker will be given to competitors when marshalling for these events.
- Club/individual's sponsor signage on craft and equipment will not be covered unless, when fitting the event sponsor signage, it is unavoidable. All competitors in these sponsored Championship events will also be required to wear lycras provided by SLSA.
- No competitor, handler and/or club is permitted to have any signwriting, logos or corporate ID on either clothing, competition apparel, gear, equipment or on the person in the competition area (including marshalling areas) which is deemed not in "good taste".
- It may be possible that TV interviews will be undertaken with prominent competitors, and in such cases, they may be asked to wear one of the official sponsor caps.

All SLSA Staff, Sectional Referees, Area Referees and the Championship Referee reserve the right to order the removal or covering of signage, ID or logos in conflict with carnival sponsors.

Refusal to comply with any of the above will render the clothing, competition apparel, or equipment ineligible for the competition, and the competitor (and/or team) may be ineligible for further participation in the Championships.

CHAMPIONSHIP MEDALS, TROPHIES AND POINTSCORE

SLSA Championship medallions will be awarded to individuals and team members gaining 1st (Gold), 2nd (Silver) or 3rd (Bronze) in all Championship events contested. A minimum of one starter is required for any event to be contested. For all events, medals will be awarded as follows:

- Three (3) or more competitors – Gold, Silver and Bronze Medals may be awarded.
- Two (2) competitors – Gold and Silver medals may be awarded.
- One (1) competitor (providing the competitor/team correctly completes the course) – Gold medal

PRESENTATIONS

Presentations of medals will occur at each area presentation dais generally at the conclusion of the final of each event. All finals place-getters are requested to go to the presentation area as soon as possible after the race.

TROPHIES/POINTSORES

The following 2021 Australian Surf Life Saving Championships overall point score categories and memorial trophies will be formally awarded at the conclusion of the final day of competition:

The point score awarded for each Champion Club, within each event's age category, will be 6 points for 1st place, down to 1 point for 6th place. If, when the Championships have concluded, there is a tied point score, the Club with the most 1st placings will be declared the winner. Failing this, the Club with the most 2nd placings to 6th placings respectively will be taken into account to determine a winner. If, after this procedure there is no single winner, then the point score will be declared a tie and dual trophies will be presented.



Note: International clubs (and/or non SLSA affiliated clubs) are not eligible to earn points towards Australian Champion Club.

DEAD HEATS

Where a dead heat (as defined in the current edition Surf Sports Manual) occurs in the final of an event, the clubs of individuals/teams will share the placing points and medal relative to the finish placing. The club of the next individuals/teams to finish will receive the relative placing points based on the number of individuals/teams finishing ahead of them. For example: if two individuals/teams finish equal 1st, both individuals/teams shall receive 6 points each and the gold medal. The next placing individual/team shall be awarded the 4 points and the bronze medal for coming 3rd.

INTERNATIONAL COMPETITOR MEDALS

If an international competitor (or club team) place (1st, 2nd or 3rd) in a Championship they will be awarded the medallion (and/or trophy) equal to the placing gained.

However, the first Australian competitor/s (or club team/s) to place will be awarded the Australian Championship Title/Placing and the equivalent medal and/or trophy.

OVERALL SLSA CHAMPION CLUB

For the overall Championship pointscore winner (Australian Surf Life Saving Championships 2021 only) the winning club will be awarded at the closing ceremony. Also awarded at this ceremony will be the Male Competitor of the Championships and Female Competitor of the Championships.

HANDICAP CHAMPION CLUB

The Handicap point score will be on a handicap system based on the Champion Club from the previous year's Australian Championships. The calculation of the winning club would be the Champion Club from the previous year's championships starting on zero points and the club that scored zero points in the previous year commencing on maximum points.

SLSA CODE OF BEHAVIOUR/MISCONDUCT

Misconduct before, during and after the Championships will not be tolerated. Offending members risk disciplinary action against themselves and their Clubs. Please refer to the current Edition Surf Sports Manual and, in particular but not limited to, section 2.27 SLSA Code of Behaviour, section 2.28 Abuse/Inappropriate Behaviour and section 2.29 Competing Unfairly and also to SLSA Policy 6.05 – Member Protection Policy (available online at Member's Area > Document Library > Governance/Policies > Policy 6.05).

MATCH FIXING AND ANTI-DOPING

Match-Fixing

The SLSA National Policy on Match Fixing and framework covers all SLS Events that are conducted by SLSA, State Centres, Branches and Clubs includes special events, conducted by third parties sanctioned by an SLS entity and any event, competition or series connected with Surf Lifesaving. Please refer to Policy Document 5.11 for further details.

Anti-Doping

Members have responsibilities under Policy 5.2 Anti-Doping Policy and Policy 6.23 Illicit Drugs in Sport (both available in the SLSA Members Portal).

It is strongly recommended that all Team Managers complete the online Sports Integrity Australia training module and conduct at least one (1) anti-doping education activity with all competitors from the Club.

ALCOHOL FREE ZONE

In 2021, The Aussies will be a dry event. The entire event footprint, including Maroochydore Beach, Alexandra Headland, Mooloolaba and surrounding back of beach areas including all container and gear storage areas are alcohol free zones. The only exception to this are licensed premises.



QLD Police will be monitoring this closely, so please ensure your teams and supporters are aware and follow this guideline.

POST EVENT ACTIVITIES

Misconduct before during and after the Championships will not be tolerated. Offending members risk disciplinary action against them themselves and their club. QLD Police will be closely monitoring behavior during and after competition each day.

SHUTTLE BUS

SLSA with the support of the Sunshine Coast Council will operate a free shuttle bus service that will transport competitors, team managers and spectators to the three event sites. The shuttle bus will operate on loop services with pick up and drop off locations as indicated on the Event Site Maps

Buses will operate on a continuous loop service with some buses operating concurrently to meet consumer demands, especially during peak times.

SHIPPING CONTAINERS

Clubs transporting containers to Broadbeach, must contact the SLSA venue manager (kbird@slsa.asn.au) and provide the following information:

In booking container transport to Broadbeach, please first email kbird@slsa.asn.au to ensure correct delivery instructions and FAQs are provided. If contact is not made, then a container will not be accepted onto site.

ACCESS TO GEAR AND EQUIPMENT COMPOUNDS

Provision has been made for Board/Ski trailer parking in the craft compound located Maroochydore Rugby Club, Fourth Ave and Kingsford Smith Pde. Under no circumstances are vehicles or trucks permitted to park or be left unattended in these areas.

SECURITY OF EQUIPMENT

Reports of missing vehicles, craft and equipment and personal belongings, are not uncommon at major events and all club Team Managers and competitors are reminded of their responsibility towards the security of their own equipment at these Championships.

Whilst allocated areas for the storage of surf craft, reels, tubes, etc. and general security surveillance personnel will be provided, the security of this equipment remains strictly under the control of the clubs and competitors and no responsibility will be accepted by Surf Life Saving Australia.

CLUB TENTS

Club tents shall only be erected in designated areas after 7.00am, Thursday 15th April 2021. Tent restricted zones are clearly marked on the site map.

Tents found in position (erected or otherwise) before this time and/or in non-designated areas, will be removed from the area. Tents will then be made available for collection at the gear compound area after Saturday 24th April 2021.

SPECTATOR VIEWING

Club supporters and spectators will have excellent viewing of the competition areas from the rear of these areas where provision has been made for the erection of club tents. Unfortunately due to COVID 19 restrictions we are unable to have grandstands at the championships



ACCESS TO COMPETITION AREA

Under no circumstances will unauthorised personnel be allowed into any competition area. The same instruction applies to competitors who loiter around the area after competing. Many people will have travelled quite some distance to witness this major event and the area at all times must project an area befitting an Australian Championships carnival. A dedicated team under the control of the Championship Referee will ensure this direction will be adhered to. The cooperation of all competitors and visitors is sincerely sought in this regard. Coaches, club officials and supporters are not permitted in the competition area; however, they may accompany their competitors into the marshalling areas.

TEAM APP

Aussies 2021 will be using the 'Team App' smart phone application to send out updates and notifications to competitors. Download 'Team App' from your App Store or Google Play. Once you have downloaded the app and created a user login, search for '**Aussies 2021**' in the search bar at the top of the screen and click on the event to join. From here you will be able to access event documentation, timetables and where to find all the latest and up to date information on the event. As a condition of entry, all competitors agree that any photography taken during the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships 2021 can be used for promotional material by SLSA. This is:

I understand that as a competitor I am participating in competition which is of national significance and agree:

- a) to be filmed, televised, photographed, interviewed and otherwise recorded for the duration of the competition, under the conditions and for the purposes authorised by SLSA;*
- b) to compete with a Go Pro or any other device, within reason, attached to equipment if requested for the purpose of obtaining best possible footage to promote the sport, unless an athlete can prove that such an attachment would hinder their performance.*
- c) that SLSA owns all rights in the photos and recordings taken in accordance with (a) and SLSA has the right to reproduce these.*
- d) if asked, I agree to wear a 'Tracker' in any event. Please note that this device is only used to enhance broadcast and audience engagement, and is not a safety device.*
