U15 U17 Open Patrol Competition

The aim is to conduct a Patrol Championship to find the best Club Patrol Team in Tasmania. The Open Patrol Competition is a Tasmanian Championship event.

Nominations: The competition will be classed as a final with entries restricted to one team (of 4 for U15 and U/17 and 6 for Open) per club unless there are less than ten teams. Clubs may indicate that they would like to enter two teams, and if all ten places are not filled, the second team from clubs (decided by ballot) will be notified that their entry has been accepted.

Note: To be eligible to compete, all members must be a registered member of SLSA, have passed a SLSA Proficiency/Skills Maintenance Test within the current season and completed the required patrol hours for his or her membership category and award.

Note: 4-Person U15 teams' members must hold a Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC)

4-person U17 teams' members must hold a Bronze Medallion (BM)

6-person Open teams are made up of the following awards

1 X Advanced Resuscitation (Award)

1 X Beach Manager/Patrol Captain (Award)

1 X IRB Driver (BM)

1 X IRB Crew (BM)

2 X BM

The Competition:

(a) Points shall be allotted for the following:

Theory Paper	20 points
Resuscitation	20 points
Lifesaving Task	40 points
Physical Skills – Surf Teams (4 person all age groups)	10 points
Physical Skills – Board/Tube Rescue Relay Race	10 points
TOTAL	100 POINTS

Each section will be conducted in accordance with:

- The SLSA Surf Sports Manual, 37th Edition
- The SLSA Public Safety and Aquatic Rescue Manual, 37th Edition

Equipment:

Each team shall provide as a minimum the following equipment:

- One Rescue Board - Note: For this event, a racing board may be used instead of a rescue board in all races, but a rescue board must still be used in the Patrol Competition scenario.
- One Rescue Tube
- A First Aid Kit (Refer 37th Surf Sports Manual)
- One pair of Swim fins (optional)

U17 Open First Aid Competition

The aim is to conduct a First Aid Championship to find the best First Aid team in Tasmania. The First Aid Competition is a Tasmanian Championship event.

Nominations: The competition will be classed as a final with entries restricted to one team (of 2 competitors) per club dependent on entry numbers. Clubs may enter more than one team, the subsequent teams from clubs will be decided by a ballot and clubs will be notified that their entry has been accepted after the closure of entries – please note clubs will be required to provide an additional assessor for every 2 teams entered.

The Competition:

Will run as per the details as set down in the Surf Sports Manual 36th Edition.

Open, U19 and U17 Teams are to consist of two (2) proficient Surf Life Saving Bronze Medallion/Cert II holders and/or current SLSA Provide First Aid Certificate (or equivalent).

U15 Teams are to consist of two (2) proficient Surf Life Saving Surf Rescue Certificate or Surf Life Saving Bronze Medallion/Cert II holders and/or current SLSA Provide First Aid Certificate (or equivalent).

Dress: The competitors of each Team shall be uniformly dressed as follows:

- Club Competition cap
- Club bathers
- White shorts and shirt, or Club coloured shorts and shirts or Patrol Uniform
- Footwear can be worn

NB: No item worn by a competitor is permitted to be used to treat a casualty.

Equipment:

Club teams are required to supply their own First Aid Kit as per the 37th Edition of the SLSA Surf Sports Manual. This kit will be inspected as per the list from pages 3-94.

Contents of this kit may be used to make up a bum bag prior to the scenario.

U15 U17 Open Champion Lifesaver Competition

The Champion Lifesaver event is an individual competition which combines physical, theoretical and practical elements.

The physical element involves a beach sprint, board race, surf race and tube race with flippers. All events are held over the standard distance applicable for each race. Points are awarded out of 10, depending on where you finish. First place receives 10 points, 2nd place 9, 3rd 8 points and so on down to 1 point.

The practical element involves two separate components – performing a simulated assessment and resuscitation on a live patient and resuscitation on a manikin. Points are deducted for errors made with 20 points awarded for each component if no errors occur.

The theoretical element involves undertaking an exam paper consisting of 40 multiple choice questions. The questions are based on the current training manual. Each correct answer scores a point.

The ultimate winner is the person who scores the highest combined points after completing all three elements. A perfect score is 120.
