SS Officials:	<p>Those clubs that have competitors participating in this seasons' events MUST supply a minimum of ONE SS Technical Official and then additional Officials for every TEN Competitors. The 1:10 ratio ensures adequate Officials are available to allow the event program to run to time and for multiple areas to be set up.</p> <p>To assist the Carnival Referee in planning and event efficiency, can all Surf Sports Managers / Junior Activities Coordinators please confirm their clubs' Officials by 5pm, Monday 23 Jan 2023.</p> <p>Please contact SLST Carnival Officials Coordinator Liz Eustace to register your Clubs Officials list – aeustace@yahoo.com.au</p>

Live Heats	<p>The event management system LiveHeats will be utilised throughout the summer at state coordinated events. It will be used for all contests involving U10 age category and older, including Masters. Reminder, once assigned a wrist band this is now your personal band and you will need to bring it to all statewide carnival and Championships events.</p> <p>Have not been assigned a wrist band? If you have not yet been assigned a wrist band then report to the registration table to be issued your individual band for the season.</p> <p>Already have a wrist band? If you have already being assigned a band then just turn up to marshal for your first event on carnival day, you are good to go!</p> <p>Lost wrist bands? Competitors requiring replacement bands, they will be available at the registration table and charged at \$20 each (unless damaged or lost during an event).</p> <p>Not sure if the band is mine? You can scan the QR code located on the back of the band with your camera on your mobile phone to find out who it's been assigned to.</p>
COVID Safety:	Please abide by all current Tasmanian Government health advice and directions.
Water Safety:	To assist with the safety and efficiency of this year's event, clubs are encouraged to assist with the provision of Water Safety where possible. Contact Ben Burbury 0427 159 922 if able to assist.
High Visibility Vests:	All competitors MUST wear high visibility vests when competing. Please refer to the Page 18 of the SLSA Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) Project Final Report – Surf Sports for further information.
Fees:	Competition fees for a Statewide Carnival will be \$15.50 per person.
Venue Information:	Details of club events will be posted on the Port Sorell SLSC Facebook page and website.
Catering:	Breakfast available from 7:30am Sunday. Meals available through food trucks and the Club Canteen Bar will not be open.
Car Parking:	Parking is available on Shearwater Park – Please see attached Map
Club Tents:	In the interests of public safety all club tents are to be secured adequately for the duration of the carnival. Compliance will be checked prior to the start of event.
Club Gear Trailers:	Gear trailers can be parked within the Port Sorell SLSC Carpark. Northern side of the club
Supplementary Regulations:	<p>All events will be contested in accordance with the rules set out in the SLSA 37th Edition Surf Sports Manual, any subsequent SLSA Bulletins and SLST Local Rules that are distributed to Surf Sports Managers via Circulars from time to time.</p> <p><i>Approved sanctioned additions to contests outside of the regulations of the Surf Sports Manual 37th Edition to be run at this event, include:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Under 8 Foamie and Under 10 Ironperson may be run if conditions permit. A final decision will be made by the carnival referee prior to the event. Note these contests will not be run at the Junior State Championships.</i> • <i>U8 age groups may not compete in a full Cameron (to include board leg. The Cameron for U8 age group may then consist of 2 waders and 2 sprinters.</i> • <i>500m/1km beach run will be conducted if beach is available to conduct event. Sandshoes permitted and recommended.</i> • <i>In team events, Male & Female events will be run if possible.</i> • <i>Mixed gender Teams will be recorded as a Male contest.</i> <p>The SLSA Surf Sports Manual (37th Revised Edition) contains full competitive conditions rules and regulations. A full version can be downloaded from the SLSA Members Area by searching in the Document Library.</p>

<p>Other important event information:</p>	<p><u>Program Schedule</u> – Please note all events and timings are subject to change at the discretion of the Carnival Referee.</p> <p><u>Rules for a race</u> – Please refer Section 2 of the SLSA Surf Sports Manual (37th Revised Edition), General Competition Conditions, for full details of age specific rulings. The combining of competitors into event categories may be permitted in the case of insufficient competitors, or for other reasons to aid the conduct of the competition. The decision to collapse or combine age categories due to small numbers is at the discretion of the Carnival Referee.</p> <p><u>Clarification of Rules & Regulations</u> - For any technical rules and regulations queries, please first refer to the SLSA Surf Sports Manual (37th Revised Edition) for full details. This is available to download from the SLSA Members Area. Please ensure you direct club members to their respective Surf Sports Manager before contacting State Centre.</p> <p><u>Competition Liaison Officers:</u> The program has been designed to allow for competitor/s from a different age category to make up an incomplete team if required. A Competition Liaison Officer will be appointed to facilitate communications regarding team composition. Age Managers are to notify the Liaison Officer if they have a team issue (i.e., waiting on a competitor from another area) as soon as marshalling for the event is called. Failure to notify at the time of marshalling will result in no delay, no start.</p> <p>U8 age groups will not compete in a full Cameron (which includes a board leg). The Cameron for U8 age group will consist of 2 waders and 2 sprinters.</p> <p>Sandshoes will be permitted in the 500m (U8 and U9) and 1km (U10/11/12/13/14) beach runs.</p>
